Overview of Mini-games (Spanish)

The following mini-games are currently available for Spanish within the Gaming Grammar game.

Each mini-game practises a particular grammatical structure (see mini-game descriptions and notes below). Each mini-game contains a tutorial, which explains the grammatical rule and introduces the game context for that mini-game.

The mini-games primarily use vocabulary taken from the NCELP SoW and top-2000 most frequent words in Spanish.
